

UNEXPECTED VISITOR AT NO.6 SCHOOL PRESENTATION

The students of No.6 school, Grades 1-4, received an unexpected visitor on Friday, June 22, before they were to make a presentation of money to Vera Styres, co-ordinator of the Childrens Aid Society in Ohsweken.

The visitor, who is probably the idle of many young boys on Six Nations, was defenseman Stan Jonathan of the Boston Bruins. He was touring the schools on the reserve that day.

He talked to the children for about a half an hour and answered their inquisitive questions which included playing for the Bruins, penalties, fights, practicing, travelling, past history, family and nervousness before a game.

After his brief question and answer period, he joined in the ceremonies of the presentation to Vera Styres. The children had worked and saved for the sum of \$16, since Easter break.

Romaine Bomberry, a teacher at the school, said that the children were encouraged to work for the money, because it would have more meaning. Vera Styres accepted the money on behalf of the Children's Aid Society and thanked the children for their donation.

The money collected will go towards a child under the care of C.A.S. The project for the children was started in conjunction with the Year of the Child, and Romaine Bomberry said that the school plans to make this project an annual event.
