That until Six Nations of the Grand River receives a response to its letter to Honourable David Tsubouchi, Minister of Community and Social Services regarding the provision of Protection Services by Six Nations Child Welfare Authority, it is Six Nation's expectation that there will be no changes in the current arrangement whereby The Children's Aid Society of Brant provides services to Six Nations through its Native Services Branch located at Six Nations.

Further it is the expectation of Six Nations that The Children's Aid Society of Brant's Board of Directors shall not move on any option, that would result in a change to the present services being delivered at Six Nations, prior to discussions with Six Nations Social Services Committee; and should it prove necessary with full Council.
